

Confession and Absolution of Sin

1. What a Difference a Day made for Peter and John

Scripture Reading......John 20:1-9

^{20:1} Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!" ³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter, who was behind him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.)

Meditationby Pastor

As you think about Holy Week and Easter, there is often one day that get overlooked. What day don't we often think about? Saturday. Can you imagine what the Saturday of that first Holy Week must have felt like to the disciples? They may have felt like failures. The week had started good as they walked into Jerusalem with the people cheering and laying down palm branches on the road. By the end of the week, they forsake Jesus. Judas would betray Jesus. Peter would deny him. They all ran as he was taken captive. A few of them, like Peter and John, had crept around in the shadows to see what was going to happen. When they looked back on their behavior over the last couple of days, it wasn't a pretty sight.

Did the disciples have doubts in Jesus? Things did happen the way that Jesus said they were, but it wasn't the way they wanted to happen. Did they wonder if they had wasted the last three years of their lives? They had looked to Jesus as the Messiah. They had told others that he was the Savior. And now? He's dead!

They were afraid. If the Jewish leaders could kill Jesus, were they safe? It also was the Sabbath. They couldn't work. They couldn't go anywhere. They had plenty of time to think about the events they had just witnessed. They had seen Jesus feed the multitudes, calm the storms and even raise the dead. But now he was dead himself. They would soon see what a difference a day would make. All their failures, guilt and fears would be removed. Jesus is alive! Their darkness and gloom would soon be scattered and broken.

2. What a Difference a Day made for Mary Magdalene

Scripture Reading...... John 20:10-18

¹⁰ Then the disciples went back to their homes, ¹¹ but Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. ¹³ They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him." ¹⁴ At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. ¹⁵ "Woman," he said, "why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷ Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am returning to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" ¹⁸ Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that he had said these things to her.

Meditationby Pastor


O Mary. It is obvious that Mary expected nothing to happen that morning except to find her Lord lying instead. She stood there outside the tomb crying. In her grief and sadness she could hardly think clearly. She gets up enough courage to look in the tomb. As she looks in the tomb, she sees two angels. The sight of these angels isn't even enough to take away her grief and sadness. She had never seen an angel. All she can say: **"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him."** She wanted to be with her Lord and Teacher one more time. She turns around, and thinks she sees the "gardener." Again, she has only one thing on her mind - **"Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him."** The only explanation she has for Jesus not being there is that someone has stolen the body.

Then it happened. He speaks one little word: **"Mary."** Everything changed. What a difference a day would make. Easter would change everything.

Jesus also knows when you are grieving, hurting, lonely, depressed, frustrated or experiencing a 100 or more emotions. All he needs to say is: "Brian" or "John" or anyone of a 100 or more different names. He know how to comfort us, calm us, encourage us and strengthen us. Mary would look at each new day in the future in a different way. Easter enables each of us to look at our lives differently. We are Sons and Daughter of our King.

3. What a Difference a Day made for the Disciples

Scripture Reading...... John 20:19-23

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Meditationby Pastor

We live in a world that is desperately looking for peace. Much of the world will never find it because they think that peace can be found in agreements, contracts, negotiations, power and force. True peace cannot be found in any of those things.


It can be found only in the empty tomb. Jesus' disciples saw that on Easter Sunday evening. They are behind locked doors. They were afraid. They were ready to jump at almost any sound. Then things changed. Jesus was standing there with them.

"Peace be with you!" It was a common greeting. But it was more than that this evening. With those words Jesus assured his disciples and us that we now have peace with God. His death brought them peace.

Have you ever gone swimming in a pool or a lake that is perfectly calm? Then you do a cannon ball. A big splash goes up (some of us more than others.). But eventually, it will return to calm. That's what Jesus does for his disciples. The last days were filled with waves. What a difference a day would make! Jesus brings them peace.

That same peace is yours and mine through faith. What a difference a day makes! In the waves of life, he also brings us peace. The empty tomb reminds us that in the darkest of moments in our lives, we have peace. Our darkness is scattered. We have peace.

Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe." ²⁸ Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!"


