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But that is what sin does – it messes things up. When sin reigns in a heart, it captures the heart's lust, pride and all kinds of other desires of selfishness. Sin consumes a person's character and integrity until all that's left is desire. The land of darkness is not a good place. It is a place in every person's heart that is here today. What happens if we begin to live in the darkness of sin? We make excuses as to why we keep doing that sin in our life. After we have made excuses long enough, we begin to rationalize sin. It's always someone else's fault. We point fingers any direction than ourselves. Then we defend sin. We choose to live in sin. We choose to live in the darkness. What are the dark places of your life? What are the parts in your heart that you don't want to be seen in the light? That makes us uncomfortable, doesn't it? But that is what repentance does. It points the finger not at everyone else, but at me. It sees sin for what it is. It is darkness.

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
