

THE FIRST LESSON Isaiah 60:1-6

Already in the Old Testament, God explained that people from other nations would come to know Jesus as the light of salvation and would worship him.

^{60:1} "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD rises upon you. ² See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the LORD rises upon you and his glory appears over you. ³ Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. ⁴ "Lift up your eyes and look about you: All assemble and come to you; your sons come from afar, and your daughters are carried on the arm. ⁵ Then you will look and be radiant, your heart will throb and swell with joy; the wealth on the seas will be brought to you, to you the riches of the nations will come. ⁶ Herds of camels will cover your land, young camels of Midian and Ephah. And all from Sheba will come, bearing gold and incense and proclaiming the praise of the LORD.



God's grace is for all people, Jews and Gentiles. St. Paul proclaimed this mystery to the Gentiles. We also proclaim that Jesus came for all.

² Surely you have heard about the administration of God's grace that was given to me for you, ³ that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written briefly. ⁴ In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵ which was not made known to men in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets. ⁶ This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus. ⁷ I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am less than the least of all God's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things. ¹⁰ His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, ¹¹ according to his eternal purpose which he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. ¹² In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence.

VERSE OF THE DAY

P: Alleluia. We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him. Alleluia. (Matthew 2:2b)

The Magi learn of the new-born King and come to worship him as their Lord and Savior. God kept them from reporting back to Herod. They returned to their home by a different route.

^{2:1} After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem² and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him." 3 When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴ When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. 5 "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written: 6"'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel." ⁷Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. 8 He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him." 9 After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. ¹¹ On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh. 12 And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

PASTOR JACOB HOFF'S INSTALLATION DATE: On Sunday, February 14th at 3:00pm, Pastor Jacob Hoff will be installed as the second pastor here at St. Paul's. More details are being worked on, and once they are set, we will continue to let everyone know. Pastor Hoff and his family will be here during this week to figure out details with housing, his move, etc. His move should happen at the end of January. We welcome him as we all work together to carry the message of Jesus to people.

EPIPHANY SEASON: This weekend, we celebrate the Festival of Epiphany of Our Lord. Epiphany is Christendom's second oldest festival: it has been celebrated continuously by the Church for nearly 1900 years. Even though the date of Epiphany is January 6, it is often celebrated on one of Sundays closest to that date. The festival was originally a general celebration of the incarnation of Jesus Christ which included the commemoration of his birth, the visit of the Magi (Wise Men), all of Jesus' childhood events up to and including his baptism. Today, the Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates Epiphany as the festival of Christ's birth, and the Western Church stresses the visit of the Magi. The season of Epiphany (the Greek word for "appearance") celebrates God's revealing or manifesting of Jesus' identity as true God, Messiah, and Savior of the world. Epiphany not only commemorates the fact that Jesus appeared to save us, but that God revealed the identity of Jesus to the world. The season of Epiphany will conclude on February 7th & 8th, with the festival of the Transfiguration of our Lord.

Our theme for the next weekends will look at the answer to this question: "Who is this Jesus?" The themes for each Sunday are:

January 10 & 11 – Who Wise Men Seek (Epiphany)

January 17 & 18 – Who Does Miraculously Things (Epiphany 2)

January 24 & 25 – Who Speaks Good News (Epiphany 3)

January 31 & Feb. 1 – Who Speaks to Young People (WISCO Sunday)

February 7 & 8 – Who Appears in Glory (Transfiguration Sunday)

SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE CLASS: The theme for our Sunday Bible Class is: "The House of the Lord." God intended for Adam and Eve to live forever with him in the Garden of Eden. What a

wonderful proposition — perfect people living with the perfect Creator. But Adam and Eve sinned and had to leave the Garden. God could have let them go their own way and then started over.
