**THE FIRST LESSON**

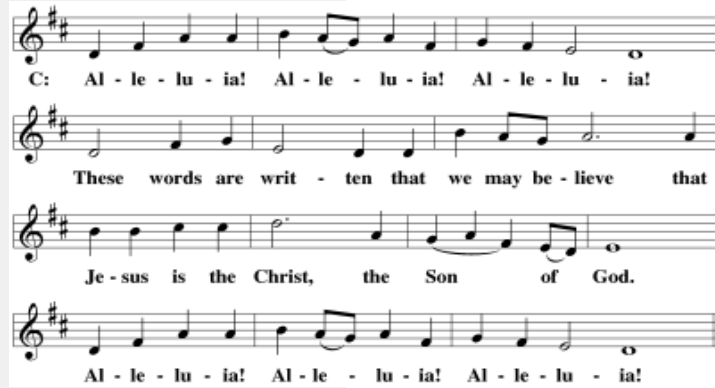
**Deuteronomy 11:1-7, 16-21**

*Moses reminds us of the purpose of Christian Education – to pass God’s promises from one generation to another.*

<sup>11:1</sup> Love the Lord your God and keep his requirements, his decrees, his laws and his commands always. <sup>2</sup> Remember today that your children were not the ones who saw and experienced the discipline of the Lord your God: his majesty, his mighty hand, his outstretched arm; <sup>3</sup> the signs he performed and the things he did in the heart of Egypt, both to Pharaoh king of Egypt and to his whole country; <sup>4</sup> what he did to the Egyptian army, to its horses and chariots, how he overwhelmed them with the waters of the Red Sea as they were pursuing you, and how the Lord brought lasting ruin on them. <sup>5</sup> It was not your children who saw what he did for you in the desert until you arrived at this place, <sup>6</sup> and what he did to Dathan and Abiram, sons of Eliab the Reubenite, when the earth opened its mouth right in the middle of all Israel and swallowed them up with their households, their tents and every living thing that belonged to them. <sup>7</sup> But it was your own eyes that saw all these great things the Lord has done. <sup>16</sup> Be careful, or you will be enticed to turn away and worship other gods and bow down to them. <sup>17</sup> Then the Lord's anger will burn against you, and he will shut the heavens so that it will not rain and the ground will yield no produce, and you will soon perish from the good land the Lord is giving you. <sup>18</sup> Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. <sup>19</sup> Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. <sup>20</sup> Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates, <sup>21</sup> so that your days and the days of your children may be many in the land that the Lord swore to give your forefathers, as many as the days that the heavens are above the earth.

SERMON

"Jesus, Help Us to Be Can't Keep Quiet Christians."

Acts 4:13-22

<sup>13</sup> When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. <sup>14</sup> But since they could see the man who had been healed standing there with them, there was nothing they could say. <sup>15</sup> So they ordered them to withdraw from the Sanhedrin and then conferred together. <sup>16</sup> "What are we going to do with these men?" they asked. "Everybody living in Jerusalem knows they have done an outstanding miracle, and we cannot deny it. <sup>17</sup> But to stop this thing from spreading any further among the people, we must warn these men to speak no longer to anyone in this name." <sup>18</sup> Then they called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. <sup>19</sup> But Peter and John replied, "Judge for yourselves whether it is right in God's sight to obey you rather than God. <sup>20</sup> For we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard." <sup>21</sup> After further threats they let them

go. They could not decide how to punish them, because all the people were praising God for what had happened. <sup>22</sup> For the man who was miraculously healed was over forty years old.

**MIDWEEK LENT 2016:** "Irony" is not a word that most people would ascribe to Jesus' passion. However, certain events in the gospel accounts—Caiaphas' unintentional prophesy, the Jewish leaders' hypocrisy, and others—are actually quite ironic. This year’s theme is **“Ironies of the Passion”** will lead us to learn about the unique and lasting significance of Jesus' ministry, death, and resurrection. The services are on Wednesdays beginning on February 10<sup>th</sup> at 3:30 pm & 6:30 pm. The schedule is:

**INSTALLATION OF PASTOR JACOB HOFF:** St. Paul’s welcomes Pastor Jacob Hoff as an Associate Pastor of our congregation. We invite you to join us for his Installation Service on Sunday, February 14th at 3:00pm. As many of you know, Pastor Hoff joins us from Sterling, Virginia. Pastor Ian Headrick, one of the Associate Pastors at Christ Lutheran in Big Bend will be delivering the sermon. The students from our Christian Day School and Adult Choir will be participating in the service as well. Following the worship service, there will be a meal to which everyone is invited to join us.

**EPIPHANY SEASON:** This weekend, we continue to celebrate the Festival of Epiphany of Our Lord. Epiphany is Christendom's second oldest festival; it has been celebrated continuously by the Church for nearly 1900 years. Even though the date of Epiphany is January 6, it is often celebrated on one of Sundays closest to that date. The festival was originally a general celebration of the incarnation of Jesus Christ which included the commemoration of his birth, the visit of the Magi (Wise Men), all of Jesus' childhood events up to and including his baptism. Today, the Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates Epiphany as the festival of Christ's birth, and the Western Church stresses the visit of the Magi. The season of Epiphany (the Greek word for "appearance") celebrates God's revealing or manifesting of Jesus' identity as true God, Messiah, and Savior of the world. Epiphany not only commemorates the fact that Jesus appeared to save us, but that God revealed the identity of Jesus to the world. The season of Epiphany will conclude on February 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>, with the festival of the Transfiguration of our Lord.

Our theme for the next weekends will look at the answer to this question: *"Who is this Jesus?"*

The themes for each Sunday are:

January 10 & 11 – Who Wise Men Seek (Epiphany)

January 17 & 18 – Who Does Miraculously Things (Epiphany 2)

January 24 & 25 – Who Speaks Good News (Epiphany 3)

January 31 & Feb. 1 – Who Speaks to Young People (WISCO Sunday)

February 7 & 8 – Who Appears in Glory (Transfiguration Sunday)
