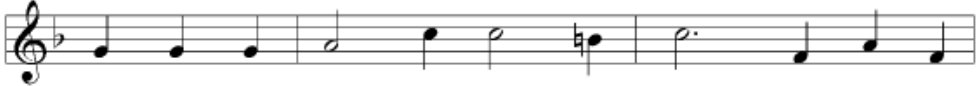

THE FIRST LESSON Jonah 4:5-11

⁵ Jonah had gone out and sat down at a place east of the city. There he made himself a shelter, sat in its shade and waited to see what would happen to the city. ⁶ Then the Lord God provided a leafy plant and made it grow up over Jonah to give shade for his head to ease his discomfort, and Jonah was very happy about the plant. ⁷ But at dawn the next day God provided a worm, which chewed the plant so that it withered. ⁸ When the sun rose, God provided a scorching east wind, and the sun blazed on Jonah's head so that he grew faint. 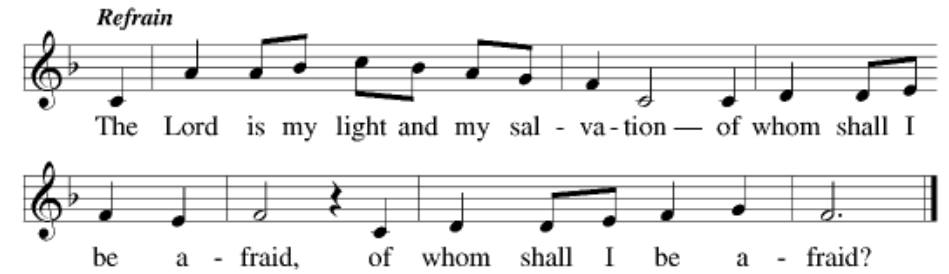
⁹ But God said to Jonah, "Is it right for you to be angry about the plant?"

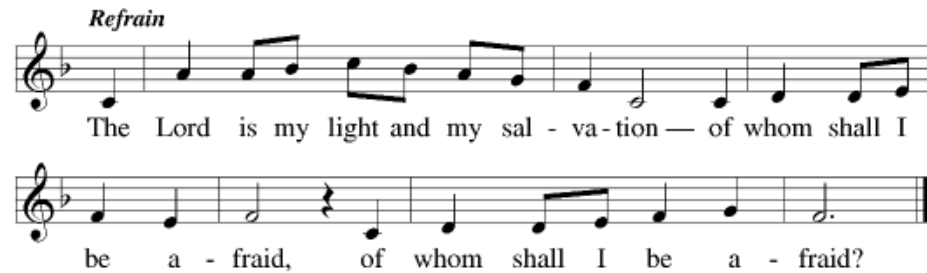

THE SECOND LESSON.....Romans 9:6b-16

^{6b} For not all who are descended from Israel are Israel. ⁷ Nor because they are his descendants are they all Abraham’s children. On the contrary, “It is through Isaac that your offspring will be reckoned.” ⁸ In other words, it is not the children by physical descent who are God’s children, but it is the children of the promise who are regarded as Abraham’s offspring. ⁹ For this was how the promise was stated: “At the appointed time I will return, and Sarah will have a son.”

¹⁰ Not only that, but Rebekah’s children were conceived at the same time by our father Isaac. ¹¹ Yet, before the twins were born or had done anything good or bad—in order that God’s purpose in election might stand: ¹² not by works but by him who calls—she was told, “The older will serve the younger.” ¹³ Just as it is written: “Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated.”

¹⁴ What then shall we say? Is God unjust? Not at all! ¹⁵ For he says to Moses,

“I will have mercy on whom I have mercy,
and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion.”

¹⁶ It does not, therefore, depend on human desire or effort, but on God’s mercy.

THE GOSPEL LESSON.....Matthew 20:1-16

^{20:1} “For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. ² He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard.

³ “About nine in the morning he went out and saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. ⁴ He told them, ‘You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.’ ⁵ So they went.

“He went out again about noon and about three in the afternoon and did the same thing. ⁶ About five in the afternoon he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, ‘Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?’

⁷ “‘Because no one has hired us,’ they answered.

“He said to them, ‘You also go and work in my vineyard.’

⁸ “When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, ‘Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first.’

⁹ “The workers who were hired about five in the afternoon came and each received a denarius. ¹⁰ So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. ¹¹ When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. ¹² ‘These who were hired last worked only one hour,’ they said, ‘and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.’

¹³ “But he answered one of them, ‘I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn’t you agree to work for a denarius? ¹⁴ Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was

hired last the same as I gave you. ¹⁵ Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?'

¹⁶ "So the last will be first, and the first will be last."

ANNOUNCEMENTS

IMPORTANT CHRISTMAS SERVICE CHANGE: Please read the following letter that was sent home to our school families this week:

Dear Parents of St. Paul's,

If you haven't heard already, consider this the official announcement: the Church Council has decided to move the Children's Christmas Service off of its traditional date of Christmas Eve. **The Children's service will now be held on the Sunday before Christmas.** This year that means **December 17th at 4:30pm.**

The all-important question: why?

This is being done primarily out of love for lost souls on the broad, wide, well-traveled path to hell. Hands down, Christmas Eve is the one day a year that has the most natural inertia for sharing the good news of Jesus with people who desperately need to hear it. Many people who normally don't think twice about going to church will consider going on Christmas Eve.

If we as a congregation are going to be serious about doing what Jesus told us to do (Matthew 28:18), then we will want to capitalize on the unique opportunity Christmas Eve affords, first, by inviting the community to join us (something we already do through a mass mailing and personal invitations) and secondly, by making our Christmas Eve services a welcoming place for any visitors who take us up on the invitation.

While there is no doubt that the Children's Service proclaims the undeserved love of God (that is why it is such a long-standing, dearly-loved tradition), as we have done it in the past, it is not a very visitor-friendly service.

Last Christmas Eve we had over 500 people in attendance. All of them heard about the love of God that sent his Son to save us! But, if you were there, think back - was it visitor-friendly? Where would a visitor have parked? Where would a visitor have sat? The parking lot was full half an hour before the service even began, so was the church. So, while the Children's Service is an awesome worship opportunity for those of us already in the family of God, it is not very visitor-friendly.

Out of love for the lost, we want to be more welcoming this Christmas Eve.

Please know that the leadership of St. Paul's did not make this decision lightly. We understand and cherish the many and long-standing traditions of the Christian Church. We are also excited to see how God can use this new tradition for the good of St. Paul's, but more importantly, for good of all those souls in our community who do not yet know what we know – God sent his Son to save us!
