**ST. PAUL'S MINISTRY BOARDS**: In an effort to better inform our members of the responsibilities of each of our Ministry Boards, each month we are featuring a description of one of the boards. This month is the Board of Elders.

#### **BOARD OF ELDERS**

## **Section 1: Membership**

The nature of the duties of this board requires that only men noted for their Christian knowledge, zeal and experience in the Spiritual work of the Kingdom of Christ shall be elected to membership. The board shall consist of at least five (5) men, including the elected Chairman of the Board. The basic objectives of this board are the spiritual welfare of the pastor(s), and members of the congregation, individually and corporately, and the supervision of everything pertaining to congregational worship.

## **Section 2: Organization**

The chairman of this board shall serve as a member of the Church Council. In the absence of the chairman, another board member shall be appointed to attend the Church Council meetings. The chairman of this board shall also serve as a member of the Salary Study Committee. Subcommittees of the Board of Elders include the Worship Committee and the Encouragement Committee. The Board of Elders shall be given the authority to create ad hoc committees to meet the changing needs of the congregation.

## A. Worship Committee:

- 1. Provide well-administered, orderly worship services. Plan and publicize the services for the year.
- 2. Approve and disapprove new forms of worship, liturgies, and hymns for use in public worship.

<sup>\*</sup>All applying persons are subject to a background check.

- 3. Together with the pastors set the time, schedule, and number of Communion services. Assist the pastors with Communion distribution and other elements of the service as required.
- 4. Maintain an adequate supply of expendable items for worship in conjunction with the altar guild.
- 5. Supervise the recruitment, training, and services of the ushers.
- 6. Maintain and supervise adequate facilities and personnel for the nursery to care for children during worship services and adult Bible classes.

## **B. Encouragement Committee:**

The Encouragement Committee will be responsible for contacting members who have not attended church in three consecutive weeks. This contact will be a telephone call and will share our concern over their absence and ask if there is anything impeding their attendance and encourage attendance. Should a situation of concern arise from this phone call, the committee member should contact one of the pastors or the contact person on the Board of Elders for follow up. An individual designated by the Board of Elders will enter attendance data each week and generate an active absentee report by Tuesday of each week. The Encouragement Committee coordinator will pick up the report Tuesday afternoon / Wednesday morning, divide the names among the committee members and distribute them for contact. Calls are to be made by Friday of each week, with results forwarded to the coordinator who will indicate the results of each call (contact made, no contact made, follow-up required) on a form that is turned over to the Board of Elders contact. The paper trail will be kept in the office and reviewed monthly by the Board of Elders.

## **Section 3: Responsibilities**

A. Prays for, encourages, and is concerned about the spiritual, emotional, and physical health and welfare of all called workers (adequate compensation, housing, free time, vacation, assistance in times of illness) and to that end specifically reviews these items once a year.

B. Counsel with the pastors so that the Word of God is preached in truth and purity, the holy Sacraments are administered in accordance with Christ's institution, and Lutheran doctrine and practices are preserved in the congregation.

C. Assist the pastors in counseling with difficult cases and in finding peaceful and Godpleasing solutions to spiritual problems within the congregation. D. Encourage the spiritual growth through regular church attendance, study of the Word, frequent reception of the Lord's Supper, a more active prayer life, and increased involvement in the mission of the church.

E. Direct and supervise the visitation of all members and make every effort to enlist them in the work of the church.

- F. Determine eligibility for membership of all individuals and families applying for membership in the congregation, according to the Constitution and Bylaws.
- G. Exercise discipline within the congregation according to Scripture, the Lutheran Confessions, and the Bylaws, and insure that the congregation functions in accordance with the established doctrine of the church as listed in the Constitution.
- H. Help maintain a proper relationship with the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod to support Christ's mission throughout the world.
- I. Review communion and church attendance of all members. Make calls on members in need.
- J. Supervise the thorough instruction of children, youth, and adults for Baptism, the rite of confirmation, and the rite of reaffirmation of faith for membership in the congregation.
- K. Be responsible for a friendly, personal welcome of visitors at worship and for reception, orientation, and integration of new members in conjunction with the Board of Outreach and the Board of Spiritual Growth.
- L. Participate in the training events the pastors conduct for elders according to a schedule upon which the pastors and the elders mutually agree.
- M. When one of the pastors permanently moves to another call, assist the other pastor in making arrangements for interim pastoral services until the new pastor arrives.
- N. Submit an annual budget request in the form and at the time requested by the congregation's Treasurer or appointed representative.

The Encouragement committee has been making phone calls since February of 2018. In the first six months the committee members have made 125 calls. There have been 105 members returned to worship because of these calls. That is a return rate of 85.6%. We thank the Lord for the return of these souls to worship and a special thank you to the committee members.

The Elder's 2018/2019 budget consist of \$8,000.00 and represents 0.9% of the overall church budget. The Elder's budget covers sheet music for the organist and choir. The budget also provides for the Convention and Conference fees for the pastors. It affords fees for guest preachers as required. It contains moneys for worship supplies: including

music licenses and copied righted material fees; consumable communion wafers and wine; and oil for the candles. The budget provides the confirmation class certificates and gift for them on behalf of the congregation.
