"Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, ²⁰ and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you—even Jesus. ²¹ Heaven must receive him until the time comes for God to restore everything, as he promised long ago through his holy prophets. ²² For Moses said, 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you must listen to everything he tells you. ²³ Anyone who does not listen to him will be completely cut off from their people.'

²⁴ "Indeed, beginning with Samuel, all the prophets who have spoken have foretold these days. ²⁵ And you are heirs of the prophets and of the covenant God made with your fathers. He said to Abraham, 'Through your offspring all peoples on earth will be blessed.' ²⁶ When God raised up his servant, he sent him first to you to bless you by turning each of you from your wicked ways."

In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea ² and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

"A voice of one calling in the wilderness,
'Prepare the way for the Lord,
make straight paths for him.'"

⁴ John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵ People went out to him from Jerusalem

and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

⁷ But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to where he was baptizing, he said to them: "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸ Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. ⁹ And do not think you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. ¹⁰ The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹ "I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹² His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

IF YOU ARE THE AGE OF 70 ½ OR OLDER, PLEASE READ: The IRS has made a deduction permanent for you that may benefit you and St. Paul's. The Qualified Charitable Deduction (QTD) is connected to retirement money like Traditional IRAs. If you coordinate with a "Qualified Charity" like St. Paul's, you can have your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) paid directly to the charity. The benefit to you is that this distribution isn't reported as taxable income. The benefit to St. Paul's is the use of these funds to carry on its mission. In addition to confirming this QTD with your tax advisor, you can coordinate this process with the treasurer of St. Paul's <u>OR</u> coordinate with the Planned Giving Committee. The Planned Giving Committee will add this to the Gift Trust Fund (GTF). You may recall that the GTF's mission is to provide tuition support to students pursuing the WELS Pastor or Teacher degrees.
