





THE GOSPEL LESSONLuke 2:25-32

When Joseph and Mary bring the Christ child to the temple for the rite of purification, Simeon praises God for keeping his promise of sending the Savior. Anna also gives thanks to God for sending the Savior, and she speaks about him "to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem."

²⁵Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

²⁹"Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. ³⁰For my eyes have seen your salvation, ³¹which you have prepared in the sight of all people, ³²a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."




