


Isaiah speaks about the Messiah who would be the Prince of Peace.




Fifth LessonLuke 1:26-33

The Angel Gabriel tells Mary what her role will be in God's plan of salvation.

²⁶ In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you." ²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. ³⁰ But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. ³¹ You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will

give him the throne of his father David, $^{\rm 33}$ and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end."



³⁹ At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, ⁴⁰ where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴² In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! ⁴³ But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴ As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵ Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!" ⁴⁶ And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord ⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, ⁴⁸ for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, ⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me — holy is his name. ⁵⁰ His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation. ⁵¹ He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. ⁵² He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. ⁵³ He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful ⁵⁵ to Abraham and his descendants forever, even as he said to our fathers."

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always.






The Distribution of the Lord's Supper

However, when you add about 40 excited children with no wrapping experience, 12 rolls of wrapping paper, and 15 rolls of tape, 'manageable' left the building. What incredible Christmas Joy! I wish all of you experience some degree of the Joy in that room this Christmas.

One twelve year girl, that started attending our program this year, is an oldest child with a younger brother and sister. She was very excited about being able to pick out and wrap presents for her siblings. After we wrapped her presents, she softly asked me if she could wrap one for herself because she never had a present before. I think she had a big smile on her face when I said "certainly" but my eyes were a little moist to say for certain. I made sure to tell the others that they could wrap one for themselves.

The children helped us create the gift bags on Wednesday night and they were distributed on Saturday. We are truly blessed, and it is wonderful to see our blessing shared with our young brothers and sisters in Christ.

150TH ANNIVERSARY PROJECT: God has blessed St. Paul's for 150 years with his Grace. Out of thanks for the Grace of God, we have begun to undertake the project of replacing our organ. The final cost of the organ is \$58,150. To date, we have received \$46,357.00. More information as to how everyone can participate in the project will be coming out soon.
