






THE CONFESSION OF SINS




Please be Seated

THE SECOND LESSON Acts 20:7-12

Eutychus wanted to hear the Apostle Paul speaking to the believers in Troas. As time went, his eyes began to grow heavy, and he slowly drifted off to sleep. He was sitting on a window sill. As he fell asleep, he fell out of the window and died. Paul hurried down the stairs and put his arms around him. Soon he again became alive.

⁷On the first day of the week we came together to break bread. Paul spoke to the people and, because he intended to leave the next day, kept on talking until

midnight. ⁸There were many lamps in the upstairs room where we were meeting. ⁹Seated in a window was a young man named Eutychus, who was sinking into a deep sleep as Paul talked on and on. When he was sound asleep, he fell to the ground from the third story and was picked up dead. ¹⁰Paul went down, threw himself on the young man and put his arms around him. "Don't be alarmed," he said. "He's alive!" ¹¹Then he went upstairs again and broke bread and ate. After talking until daylight, he left. ¹²The people took the young man home alive and were greatly comforted.

Jesus sent out 72 of his believes with the task of spreading his Word to others. He also tells them that there will be those who will not pay attention to that Word and reject Jesus's words.

⁶Then Jesus went around teaching from village to village. ⁷Calling the Twelve to him, he sent them out two by two and gave them authority over evil spirits. ⁸These were his instructions: "Take nothing for the journey except a staff — no bread, no bag, no money in your belts. ⁹Wear sandals but not an extra tunic. ¹⁰Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that town. ¹¹And if any place will not welcome you or listen to you, shake the dust off your feet when you leave, as a testimony against them." ¹²They went out and preached that people should repent. ¹³They drove out many demons and anointed many sick people with oil and healed them.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER






