
THE FIRST LESSON...... Joshua 24:1,2a,14-18

Joshua calls to those who have been richly fed by the life-giving Word of the Lord and who have seen in God's mighty and saving acts his faithfulness to that Word. In view of all that they have heard and seen, he urges them to a public confession of loyalty to that Word in a hostile world. For not all of the heathen had yet been driven out; even among the Israelites there were still the faithless. Faithfulness to him in the midst of godlessness and apostasy remains the only appropriate response of God's people to his saving Word and works.

^{24:1} Then Joshua assembled all the tribes of Israel at Shechem. He summoned the elders, leaders, judges and officials of Israel, and they presented themselves before God.² Joshua said to all the people, ¹⁴ "Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your forefathers worshiped beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD.¹⁵ But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD." ¹⁶ Then the people answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD to serve other gods! ¹⁷ It was the LORD our God himself who brought us and our fathers up out of Egypt, from that land of slavery, and performed those great signs before our eyes. He protected us on our entire journey and among all the nations through which we traveled. ¹⁸ And the LORD drove out before us all the nations, including the Amorites, who lived in the land. We too will serve the LORD, because he is our God."

THE SECOND LESSON......Ephesians 5:21-31

We follow after and cling to the Word of the Lord, no matter what the flesh says and no matter what the world says. For by the miracle of baptism, he has made us spotless and holy. In love and gratitude to him for his grace, we embrace all that he has said and shun the rebellion that would make us unholy and separate us from him.

²¹ Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. ²² Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior.²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything. 25 Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved

the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless.²⁸ In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself.²⁹ After all, no one ever hated his own body, but he feeds and cares for it, just as Christ does the church — 30 for we are members of his body. 31 "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."

VERSE OF THE DAY

P: Alleluia. Jesus Christ has destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. Alleluia. (1Timothy 1:10b cf. NIV)

Those who refused the saving food and divine wisdom offered in the Word go away from Jesus grumbling. Jesus' response is sorrow at their departure. But that sorrow does not move him to compromise the truth; for he continues by boldly confessing equally difficult truths about his coming triumph. The Spirit who gives life by the bread of life prompts the likewise bold confession from Peter to the divine person and work of the Savior. That beautiful confession, inspired by the Word and based upon it, comes at a moment when friends had gone away-a tribute to the effectiveness of the Word in the face of what must have been very painful opposition.

⁶⁰ On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?" ⁶¹ Aware that his disciples were grumbling about this, Jesus said to them, "Does this offend you? ⁶² What if you see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before! ⁶³ The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. ⁶⁴ Yet there are some of you who do not believe." For Jesus had known from the beginning which of them did not believe and who would betray him. ⁶⁵ He went on to say, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled him." ⁶⁶ From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. ⁶⁷ "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve. ⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."




THE APOSTLES' CREED


THE LORD'S PRAYER




