THE FIRST LESSON.....

...Micah 6:6-8

The princes, priests and prophets were cruel to God's people. They didn't have a heart for the helpless. God would send the prophet Micah to denounce the corruption and heartless behavior of the political and spiritual leaders of that day.

<sup>6</sup> With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? <sup>7</sup> Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? <sup>8</sup> He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.



Taste and see that the <u>LORD</u> is good;\*

blessed are they who take refuge in him.

The eyes of the LORD are on the <u>right</u>eous\*

and his ears are attentive to their cry.

#### THE SECOND LESSON.....James 2:14-26

James shows us that God wants our faith to be more than good intentions. He wants us to demonstrate our faith in acts of kindness, mercy and charity. We are saved not be our deeds, but our deeds show the faith that is in our hearts.

<sup>14</sup> What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save him? <sup>15</sup> Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. <sup>16</sup> If one of you says to him, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? <sup>17</sup> In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. <sup>18</sup> But someone will say. "You have faith: I have deeds." Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by what I do. <sup>19</sup> You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that — and shudder.  $^{20}$  You foolish man, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless? <sup>21</sup> Was not our ancestor Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? <sup>22</sup> You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. <sup>23</sup> And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend. <sup>24</sup> You see that a person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone. <sup>25</sup> In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? <sup>26</sup> As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.

#### VERSE OF THE DAY

P: Alleluia. Happy are they who hear the Word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience. Alleluia. (Luke 8:15 cf. RSV)





#### THE GOSPEL LESSON......Luke 10:30-37

The parable of the Good Samaritan shows what it means to love our neighbor as ourselves. The "religious" people – the Jew and the Levite "passed by on the other side." The most despicable person – a Samaritan whom the Jews hated – helped him and went the "extra mile." Jesus says, "Go and do likewise."

<sup>30</sup> In reply Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. <sup>31</sup> A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. <sup>32</sup> So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. <sup>33</sup> But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. <sup>34</sup> He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn and took care of him. <sup>35</sup> The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'<sup>36</sup> "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man

who fell into the hands of robbers?" <sup>37</sup> The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

THE SERMON ......Micah 6:6-8

The Prophet with a Heart for the Helpless

The Assyrians had destroyed the Northern Kingdom of Israel. But God had miraculously saved Jerusalem by sending an angel. Following that rescue, Jerusalem would once again enjoy a time of prosperity. That prosperity would produce the extremes of a greedy wealthy class and a victimized poor class. Conditions had become so bad that no one trusted each other. These social evils were symptomatic of the spiritual poverty in Judah. Idolatry was wide-spread. It was against this background that the Lord sent his prophet Micah to speak to his people in Judah. He would denounce the corruption and heartless behavior of the political and spiritual leaders of that day.
