THE SECOND LESSON......1 Thessalonians 4:13:18

The Apostle Paul spells out just what will happen on that day of the Lord's return. Christ himself will appear coming down. This will be just the reverse of what the disciples saw at Jesus' Ascension when they watched him go up until a cloud hid him from their sight.

¹³Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. ¹⁴We believe that Jesus died and rose again and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. ¹⁵According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left till the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. ¹⁶For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸Therefore encourage each other with these words.









DISTRIBUTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER


