
THE CONFESSION OF SINS








Even though we may feel crushed at times, God promises that we will not be crushed. Therefore, we do not lose heart as we face the difficulties of this life.

⁷But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. ⁸We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. ¹⁰We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. ¹¹For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that his life may be revealed in our mortal body. ¹²So then, death is at work in us, but life is at work in you. ¹³It is written: "I believed; therefore I have spoken." All donations are much appreciated and the proceeds from this sale will benefit a mission within our synod.
- **SOUTHSIDE MINISTRIES:** We had a wonderful summer with the Southside Ministries at St. Peter's. We had regular attendance at the ESL classes although there wasn't much homework to help with. Most of the children attend Summer School throughout the city but there isn't much homework. We had about 10 of the Karen children (split between volunteers and students) attend St. Paul's VBS in July. ESL classes were split between playground time, summer reading, and Bible stories. It was a lot of fun to get to know the kids better and have some enjoyable downtime.

Many Karen children are now attending Christ/St. Peter's school where they can learn about their Savior every day. This year, as in past years, St. Paul's members have been very generous in donating school supplies, clothing, and food through the collection barrel. A great start to the school year - Thank you. The families are mostly young and poor. Your help is a tremendous blessing and greatly appreciated. We have Food Pantry every third Saturday of the month. Groceries are distributed to around 125 families from St. Peter's Community Center for people in their neighborhood. There are also 100 bags made up for distribution to families of Asian Immigrants throughout the city. This past Saturday, we had some Icee Pops for the young children when we delivered the groceries. We went through 81 of them delivering to the 50 families on the Southside route and every one of them brought a huge smile. It is a blessing in abundance to be able to work with the children. Finding warm clothing, supplies, transportation, helping with homework, etc. – the challenge is the number of souls we are serving. We could sure use your help (and prayers) on whatever level you could help.

We could use more homework helpers for the ESL classes, particularly on Wednesdays. You don't need any language skills. The children are elementary school through high school. There are around 50 children attending every night and we want to see that they all get help. We have class Mondays and Wednesday nights from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM at St. Peter's Community Center on 8th and Scott. It is a great way for high school students to get community service credit for school. If you have any questions or would like to get involved, please call Gary Eickhorst at 423-1077.
