PASTORAL NEEDS UPDATE: The work related to assessing and addressing the ministerial needs of St Paul's continues. On Tuesday August 26th, the Church Council and members of the Board of Elders met with District President David Rutschow to conduct an analysis of St Paul's ministry and to discuss the calling process. This meeting has led, and will lead, to further discussion among the Board of Elders and the Church Council, shaping the roles and responsibilities of our pastor(s), as well as articulating ministry priorities going forward.

At this past Tuesday night's (9/9) Church Council meeting, the Council formally approved recommending to the Congregation to move forward to call a second pastor for St. Paul's. This recommendation will be acted upon by the Voters Assembly in the future.

Over the coming weeks, the list of pastoral roles and responsibilities for both pastors will be revised and aligned with the ministry plan that continues to develop as a part of this calling process. Once that work is completed, this information will be presented to the congregation in an open forum. The plan is to set a date for the Open Forum by the Church Council when it meets next on October 14th.

In the meantime, everyone is encouraged to share their thoughts and ideas with any member of the Board of Elders or the Church Council.
