
THE PSALMS OF THANKSGIVING



THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON Deuteronomy 8:10-18

When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the Lord your God for the good land he has given you. ¹¹ Be careful that you do not forget the Lord your God, failing to observe his commands, his laws and his decrees that I am giving you this day. ¹² Otherwise, when you eat and are satisfied, when you build fine houses and settle down, ¹³ and when your herds and flocks grow large and your silver and gold increase and all you have is multiplied, ¹⁴ then your heart will become proud and you will forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. ¹⁵ He led you through the vast and dreadful wilderness, that thirsty and waterless land, with its venomous snakes and scorpions. He brought you water out of hard rock. ¹⁶ He gave you manna to eat in the wilderness, something your ancestors had never known, to humble and test you so that in the end it might go well with you. ¹⁷ You may say to yourself, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." ¹⁸ But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your ancestors, as it is today.

Cry out with joy to the Lord, all you lands. Serve the Lord now with gladness, come before him singing for joy. *Refrain*

Know that the Lord is God! He made us we are his, his people, the sheep of his flock! Refrain Go, now within his gates giving thanks. Enter his courts singing praise, give him thanks and bless his name! Refrain Indeed, how good is the Lord, his mercy endures forever, for the Lord he is faithful, he is faithful form age to age!



I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. ¹¹I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. ¹² I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. ¹³I can do all this through him who gives me strength. ¹⁴ Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles. ¹⁵ Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only; ¹⁶ for even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me aid more than once when I was in need. ¹⁷ Not that I desire your gifts; what I desire is that more be credited to your account. ¹⁸ I have received full payment and have more than enough. I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. ¹⁹ And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus. ²⁰ To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

THE GOSPEL LESSON...... Luke 17:11-19

Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy ^h met him. They stood at a distance ¹³ and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" ¹⁴ When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed. ¹⁵ One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. ¹⁶ He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? ¹⁸ Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹ Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

The First Article of the Apostles Creed

An explanation from Martin Luther's Small Catechism

I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God made me and every creature and that he gave me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my mind and all my abilities.

And I believe that God still preserves me by richly and daily providing clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, cattle, and all I own, and all that I need to keep my body and life, and by defending me against all danger and guarding and protecting me from all evil.

All this God does only because he is my good and merciful Father in heaven, and not because I have earned or deserved it. For all this I ought to thank and praise, to serve and obey him.

This is most certainly true.

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

M: Eternal and loving Lord, at this time of national thanksgiving we remember with grateful hearts all the blessings you have showered on your people for another year. The sun rises and sets each day by your power. The earth spins in its regular orbit, and the planets and stars move across the heavens under your control. The skies pour out rain, and the land produces food according to your wisdom. With your guidance, talented and industrious people invent, manufacture, and supply what we need and desire for our lives. What can we say as we consider how richly you have blessed us?

C: Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, and his mercy endures forever.

- M: Righteous God, you are not unaware of our sins. You know that we were born with the disease of sin, and you see the sins we commit everyday--too many to mention. But you have not destroyed us, nor have you punished us as we deserved. You sent your Son to take our place under the crushing weight of guilt. You accepted his sinless life in place of our sinful lives, and punished him instead of us. Through Holy Baptism you worked in us the miracle of faith and now, with your Spirit's power and by your Word and Sacraments, you sustain that miracle day after day. What can we say when we think of what you have done for us in Christ?
- C: Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits. He forgives all my sins and crowns my life with love and compassion.
- M: We thank you today for all the blessings you have showered on Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church. Week after week you enable us to gather here to proclaim the message of your love in speech, song, and symbol. By this gospel you forgive our sins, strengthen our faith, and empower us to live for you and others. What can we say?

C: Our mouths shall speak in praise of the Lord.

M: Now we pray that you would guide and guard us in the future as you have in the past. Pour out your wisdom on those we have called and appointed to lead us in our ministry and service. Enable us to work together in love, to rejoice in our progress, and sustain our vision. As we carry out our ministry here, keep us mindful of the responsibilities we share with fellow Christians in our church body. Lead us to be generous as we bring our offerings so that the gospel may be proclaimed not only on our corner but also to the ends of the earth. The future is full of opportunities and challenges: never easy, always difficult. What can we say?

C: God is our God forever and ever; he will be our guide even to the end.

- M: Use all we have, O Lord--our wealth, our abilities, our time, and our energy-to bring glory to you and good to people around us. Lead us all to make Christ the head of our homes. Allow our national stability to be a cause for us to increase our mission efforts. Give us wisdom and faith to look past the luxuries of this life to that which has eternal value. As we think of the blessings that come from Christ, we pray:
- C: May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face shine on us, that his ways may be known on earth and his salvation among all nations.
- M: We pray especially today for those who are not able to join family and friends on this national holiday. Let them find joy in your presence and wrap them in your arms of love. We pray for those who are sick and suffering on this day, and for those who may close their eyes in death. Keep watch over their beds and show them the light of your grace. We pray for those who serve in our military forces, for those who have been wounded in battle, and for the families of those who have given their lives in service to our nation. Show them the face of your Son that they may come to see him as their King and Savior. When we think of others less fortunate than we, what can we say?
- C: Let all who are wise listen to these things and remember the great love of the Lord.
- M: Help us to receive all your blessings with thankful and humble hearts. We do not deserve your physical blessings any more than we merit the gift of your salvation. Destroy our sinful pride, protect us from Satan's temptations, and grow in us a true spirit of love and service. In everything we do, as members of a family, as citizens in this land, and as members of this congregation, lead us to believe and say:
- C: Not to us, O Lord, not to us but to your name be the glory because of your love and faithfulness.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

M: Almighty God, we thank you for teaching us the things you want us to believe and do. Help us by your Holy Spirit to keep your Word in pure hearts that we may be strengthened in faith, guided in holiness, and comforted in life and in death, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
