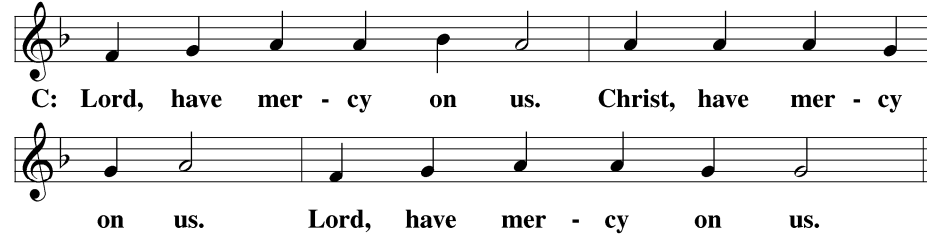
THE CONFESSION OF SINS

THE SECOND LESSON..... 1 Corinthians 1:1-9

THE GOSPEL LESSON..... John 1:29-41

²⁹The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! ³⁰This is the one I meant when I said, ‘A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.’ ³¹I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel.”

³²Then John gave this testimony: “I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. ³³I would not have known him, except that the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, ‘The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is he who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.’ ³⁴I have seen and I testify that this is the Son of God.”

³⁵The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. ³⁶When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, “Look, the Lamb of God!”

³⁷When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. ³⁸Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, “What do you want?”

They said, “Rabbi” (which means Teacher), “where are you staying?”

³⁹“Come,” he replied, “and you will see.”

So they went and saw where he was staying, and spent that day with him. It was about the tenth hour.

⁴⁰ Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. ⁴¹ The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ).



THE NICENE CREED

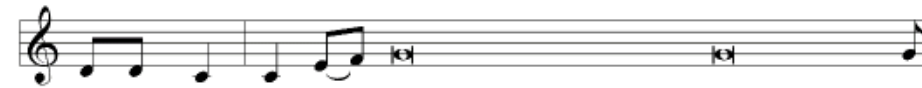

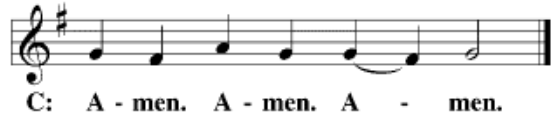

The first couple of years, we wanted to surprise the children and assembled the 200 baskets with the help

of a couple of adult volunteers. The surprise is gone when you do it every year and it took a long time on a weeknight to assemble these. The last couple of years, we have used our ESL children to assemble the gift bags. It makes it a lot more fun, takes a lot less time, and I believe it's going to be fond childhood memories for the children. Previous Christmases, it was a real challenge to get enough small toys to put in gift bags. The last two years, the challenge has been finding a place to store all the toys for the gift bags and the Christmas party. I've become a big fan of Beanie Babies. I think they're breeding in the storage bins. In the Bible, Jesus performed a miracle with bread and fish but I think he is working with Beanie babies now. Thank you for your generosity. It's unbelievable the number of donations we've received at Christmas and throughout the year. The only downside of Christmas was the snowstorms before Christmas. St. Paul's Christmas caroling and the Karen Christmas service at St. Peter's were canceled. Distributing the Food Pantry and gift bags was very challenging in the inner city at the tail end of one of the storms. My van got stuck a few times and my helper's feet were getting cold trudging through the snow all morning. The big smiles we received from the families and children warmed us. A special challenge this year was Christmas trees. I had a few artificial trees donated and in trying to find out who needed a tree, I asked a few families. After placing all the trees I had, I was given another name of a family with 3 girls and the oldest was 7. At tutoring, I got a sick feeling when the oldest told me she was so excited because someone was bringing them a Christmas tree. I arranged with their mother that I would deliver a tree on the Sunday night, a week before Christmas. That Sunday morning after church, Pastor Adams gave me an envelope with a donation that he had received, just in time for the afternoon shopping. What a special Christmas memory I'll always have of those three little faces watching for me out the window, giving them red stocking hats and cookies, and the excitement they had decorating their first tree with tinsel, ornaments, and candy canes. On the week between Christmas and New Year's, we held a Christmas party for the ESL children with cookies, hot chocolate, popcorn, movies, music, and presents. It was a wonderful time. There hasn't been a let-up for the holidays. I've had several furniture deliveries and the donations have been overflowing the cart weekly. There seems to be unending donations meeting unending needs. God bless your generosity. It is deeply appreciated. Thank you again for making this all this possible.
