


THE FIRST LESSON Exodus 34:29-35

The radiant glory of the Lord could be seen reflected in the face of Moses. With hearts veiled by the shame of sin, the people of Israel could not look upon Moses' face. The stark contrast between the Lord's glory and our own darkened countenances reminds us of our guilt yet foretells of the glory that awaits us through the Lord's Anointed.

²⁹ When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the Testimony in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the LORD. ³⁰ When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. ³¹ But Moses called to them; so Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. ³² Afterward all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the LORD had given him on Mount Sinai. ³³ When Moses finished speaking to them, he put a veil over his face. ³⁴ But whenever he entered the LORD's presence to speak with him, he removed the veil until he came out. And when he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, ³⁵ they saw that his face was radiant. Then Moses would put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with the LORD.

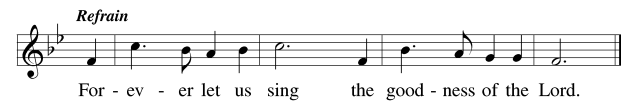

THE SECOND LESSON 2 Corinthians 4:3-6

The glory of the Old Covenant of Sinai fades, giving way to the New Covenant as seen in the unending glory of Jesus Christ. But it is a hidden glory, veiled from the self-righteous unbelievers of this age. In his grace, God has caused the light of his glory to be seen by hearts of faith in the face of Christ.

³ And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

THE GOSPEL LESSON..... Luke 9:28-36

Once again Jesus is revealed as the Lord's Anointed. Basking in the divine glory that has been his from eternity, the Son of Man is proclaimed to be God the Son with the approval of God the Father. We stand with Moses and Elijah, the disciples, and saints throughout the ages in this sure and certain hope: the Christ has come and our salvation is at hand.

²⁸ About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. ²⁹ As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. ³⁰ Two men, Moses and Elijah, ³¹ appeared in glorious splendor, talking with Jesus. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem. ³² Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. ³³ As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." (He did not know what he was saying.) ³⁴ While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and enveloped them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ A voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him." ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves, and told no one at that time what they had seen.

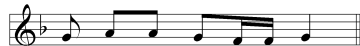

MIDWEEK LENT 2016: "Irony" is not a word that most people would ascribe to Jesus' passion. However, certain events in the gospel accounts—Caiaphas' unintentional prophesy, the Jewish leaders' hypocrisy, and others—are actually quite ironic. This year's theme is **"Ironies of the Passion"** will lead us to learn about the unique and lasting significance of Jesus' ministry, death, and resurrection. The services are on Wednesdays beginning on February 10th at 3:30 pm & 6:30 pm. The schedule is:

- Ash Wednesday (Feb. 10) – "This Man Went Home Justified" (Pastor Adams)
- Lent 2 (Feb. 17) – "It is Better that One Man Die for the People (Pastor Unnasch)
- Lent 3 (Feb. 24) – "He Had Been Waiting to See Jesus" (Pastor Gaertner)
- Lent 4 (Mar. 2) – "We Have No King but Caesar" (Pastor Hoff)
- Lent 5 (Mar. 9) – "Don't You Fear God" (Pastor Ellenberger)
- Lent 6 (Mar. 16) – "Not During the Feast" (Pastor Marshall)

INSTALLATION OF PASTOR JACOB HOFF: St. Paul's welcomes Pastor Jacob Hoff as an Associate Pastor of our congregation. We invite you to join us for his Installation Service on Sunday, February 14th at 3:00pm. As many of you know, Pastor Hoff joins us from Sterling, Virginia. Pastor Ian Headrick, one of the Associate Pastors at Christ Lutheran in Big Bend will be delivering the sermon. The students from our Christian Day School and Adult Choir will be participating in the service as well. Following the worship service, there will be a meal to which everyone is invited to join us.

EPIPHANY SEASON: This weekend, we continue to celebrate the Festival of Epiphany of Our Lord. Epiphany is Christendom's second oldest festival; it has been celebrated continuously by the Church for nearly 1900 years. Even though the date of Epiphany is January 6, it is often celebrated on one of Sundays closest to that date. The festival was originally a general celebration of the incarnation of Jesus Christ which included the commemoration of his birth, the visit of the Magi (Wise Men), all of Jesus' childhood events up to and including his baptism. Today, the Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates Epiphany as the festival of Christ's birth, and the Western Church stresses the visit of the Magi. The season of Epiphany (the Greek word for "appearance") celebrates God's revealing or manifesting of Jesus' identity as true God, Messiah, and Savior of the world. Epiphany not only commemorates the fact that Jesus appeared to save us, but that God revealed the identity of Jesus to the world. The season of Epiphany will conclude on February 7th & 8th, with the festival of the Transfiguration of our Lord.

Our theme for the next weekends will look at the answer to this question: *"Who is this Jesus?"* The themes for each Sunday are:

- January 10 & 11 – Who Wise Men Seek (Epiphany)
- January 17 & 18 – Who Does Miraculously Things (Epiphany 2)
- January 24 & 25 – Who Speaks Good News (Epiphany 3)
- January 31 & Feb. 1 – Who Speaks to Young People (WISCO Sunday)
- February 7 & 8 – Who Appears in Glory (Transfiguration Sunday)

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SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE CLASS: The theme for our Sunday Bible Class is: *"The House of the Lord."* God intended for Adam and Eve to live forever with him in the Garden of Eden. What a wonderful proposition – perfect people living with the perfect Creator. But Adam and Eve sinned and had to leave the Garden. God could have let them go their own way and then started over. - The Lord's Dream House (Heaven)
