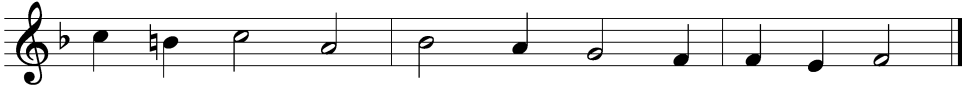

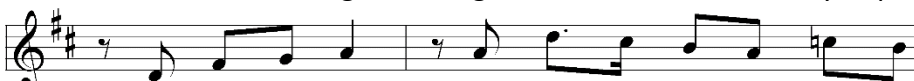

THE FIRST LESSON 1 Chronicles 29:1–2, 10–18

In faith, the people of Israel understood that all their wealth came from the LORD. So, they joyfully embraced the privilege of donating generously to the construction of the LORD's temple.

¹Then King David said to the whole assembly: “My son Solomon, the one whom God has chosen, is young and inexperienced. 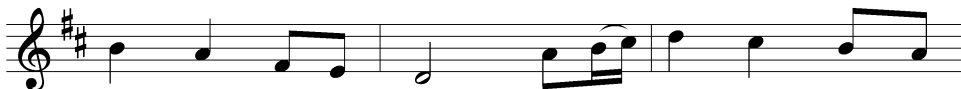

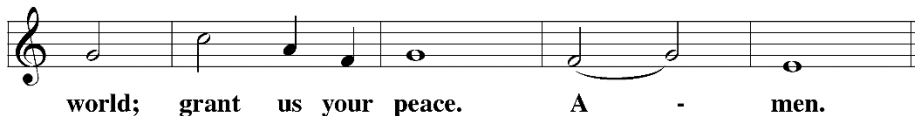
