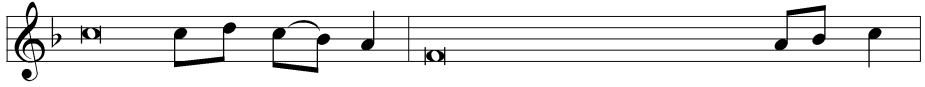



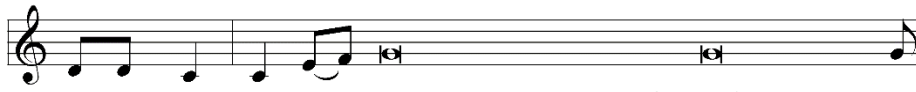

**FINANCIAL UPDATE AND SPECIAL APPEAL:** We are profoundly grateful for your ongoing and generous voluntary support. Our budget, established last June, is currently projecting a shortfall of approximately \$35,000. - Not employing a full-time first-grade teacher
- Postponing plans for additional support for Pastor Adams, including the potential for a second Pastor
- Reducing our financial support for WELS missions.

To avoid further critical cuts to our ministry and outreach, we come to you today to ask for your special financial support. We ask that you prayerfully consider how you can help reverse this trend, trusting in our Heavenly Father to guide our hearts and hands.
